Banquet Chair, Sally Johnson outdid herself, as usual, and provided each guest with a Banquet Program with a California State Quarter theme, with a sample from each mint mounted in the cover and a tribute to 'Hall of Fame' member, Frank Corral. Everyone also received a 'Goodie Bag' with a SJCC wooden nickel, two 2004 Keelboat nickels, various candies, a chance to win a pair of the new Minnesota State Quarters and other misc. items. (The nickels and quarters were a donation from the Johnson Family) The winners of the Minnesota Quarters were Tom Kerns, Al Fraumeni, Bill Meadows, Chuck Call and Dorothy Galovich.

At the conclusion of dinner, President, John Sarti opened the program, welcoming all of the guests and thanking Banquet Chair, Sally Johnson and all others who contributed to the banquet. John went on to recognize Life Members, Richard Shusterman and Chuck Woodruff for reaching their 15 years of membership. Richard was in attendance. John also recognized Hall of Fame members, Larry Benson, Ken Barr and Ray Johnson as well as Past Presidents John Schmidt (4/76-4/77), Larry Benson (4/81-4/83), Ken Barr (4/83-4/85), Ray Johnson (4/93-4/95), Al Lo (11/98-4/01) and Sally Johnson (4/01-4/03).

The program continued with the, much anticipated, induction of this year's member into the Hall of Fame. It was a proud moment, as Youth Member and Club Historian; Ryan Johnson had the honor of reading the credentials and

The next item on the agenda was the presentation of the 'Presidential Awards'. President, John Sarti gave out 13 antique copper 'Presidential Medals' and 36 'Presidential Sets' of 5 off-strike medals in a Capital Plastics holder. These awards are for members who perform, in varying degrees, above and beyond the normal call of duty. John also gave each of the outgoing Board Members a Triplet 10x Magnifier as a parting gift.

John then turned the microphone over to Medals Chair, Gary Acquistapace, who gave certificates to all of the show ticket sellers. The most outstanding sellers were awarded prizes, in addition to their certificates. Member and Local Dealer, Sal Falcone (10 books) won the drawing, Member, Bill Higgins (15 books) won Second Place (2 peso Gold), and Frank Corral (19 books) won First Place (5 peso Gold).

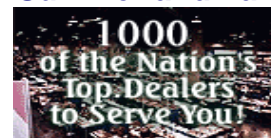
