Bishop, on May 10 at the Moscone West ANA show site to review their status. Present, from SJCC, was **General Show Chair, Ken Barr, Asst. General Show Chair, Larry Benson, Page Chair, Sally Johnson, Patron Chair, Gordon Donnell, Numismatic Theatre Chair, Stan Turrini, Registration Chair, Al Lo**, and **Volunteers, Ryan Johnson and Ray Johnson**. Also present, from other Bay Area Clubs was **Message Center Chair, Mike Stanley and Volunteers, Michael Whalen and Mark Clark**. **Ken** submitted three show postal cancellation options. The Board approved the California quarter design. **Ken** presented a draft of the General Chair Welcome message. The Board approved the message after making a minor change. **SJCC ANA Medal Design Chair, Al Lo** presented obverse and reverse proposed designs. The Board voted on the designs. **Gary Acquistapace** made the motion (seconded by **Larry Benson**) to produce 300 silver medals, 400 golden bronze medals and 700 copper medals. Motion passed. **Gary Acquistapace** made the motion (seconded by **Al Lo**) to sell 250 sets containing the 3 medals for \$25. The motion passed. **Larry Benson** will check on cost of a 3 medal set holder. This could increase the cost of the 3 medal set. **Larry Benson** displayed 2 Sample shirts to be worn by SJCC volunteers at the ANA show. The dark blue polo shirt, with a pocket, was chosen. A total of 120 dark blue shirts were approved with 80 shirts to display the ANA logo on the sleeve for the volunteers at the show and the remainder to sell at the show.

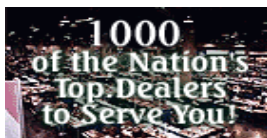
