AT THE MAY 21ST BOARD MEETING

He welcomed 12 seated members and 1 guest - **Ron Ishizaki**. **Recording Secretary, Allison Paker** read the minutes from the May 9, 2007 General Meeting, which were approved as read. **Corresponding Secretary, Al Lo** requested a key for the post office box. He reviewed some letters we received from several ANA candidates. **Treasurer, Larry Benson** gave his financial report.

The club's Wells Fargo Savings Account has been closed and the funds moved into the checking account. **Historian, Sally Johnson** reported that Member, Briita Ehlers has given her a CD of photos from the banquet. **Board Member, Bill Hurja** announced that he will be making a presentation on 'Die Varieties and Errors' at the June General Meeting. **Medals Chair, Lyle Okamoto** reported that the new medal designs have been given to Masterpiece Medallions for minting. **Picnic Chair, Al Lo** has received 8 reservations, so far, and a picnic form will go out with the next newsletter. **Youth Advisor, Sally Johnson** reported that **Vice President, Ryan Johnson** led a discussion on World Coins, aided by a map, with two other youth members. **Librarian, Ed Sins** announced that, simply by request, the club will be receiving a free book, titled 'Obsolete Paper Money' issued by Banks in the United States. **Membership Chair, Ed Sins** submitted an application for membership from **John Woodward**. After a motion and voting, he was accepted.

OLD BUSINESS **Board Member, Martha Davis** presented the changes that were made to the Constitution/Bylaws, as voted on at the April General Meeting. A discussion followed about what the exact wording should be of Amendment 32 concerning the Web Master. "FIRST WIVES CLUB"

It always makes for a great story. These 'Golden First Spouse' \$10, ½ ounce coins are a beautiful addition to this years crop of Mint offerings; the first two due out June 19th. With them, comes their story. At 26 years old, Martha Dandridge Custis, became a widow, with two children. Two years later, she made the catch of the century, and married George Washington. He, not only was the father of our country and first President of the United States, but was a father to her two children. Due to her involvement and presence during the Revolutionary War, she was a very popular figure at the side of her very popular husband.



Abigail Smith married John Adams when she was 20. Although separated, from him, much of the time she remained his best friend, advisor, confidante and love of his life. She had no formal education, where as Adams was a Harvard educated attorney, making them an unlikely match. She and her husband were the first occupants of the White House.
