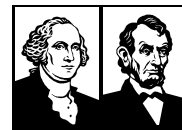

At the January Board Meeting, **President, Ryan Johnson** welcomed twelve board members and one guest, **Ron Ishizaki**. Absent were **Vice President, Bill Hurja**, **Youth President, Evan Menzes** and **Board Member, Renee Menzes**. **Medals Chair, Gordon Stubbs** gave his SJCC show report. **Gordon** passed around two hand-outs, both titled, "SJCC Show Report." **Treasurer, Ray Johnson** reported on the bourse income and treasury balance and will have a final show report next time. **Historian, Sally Johnson** reported saving a Double Tree hotel card key with San Jose Coin Club printed on the card. **Medals Chair, Gordon Stubbs** reported that we sold some medals. Of the approximately fifteen un-numbered silver medals, we only have 3-4 left. **Nominating Committee Chair, Al Lo** reported that he is still working on nominations. **Banquet Chair, Ron Ishizaki** reported that he has an appointment to speak to the catering manager at Summit Steak and Saloon, located at the Holiday Inn at I-101 and Burnell Road. Ron was shooting for an April 24, 2010, banquet date. **Sally Johnson** noted that our highest banquet attendance was about 55, and our lowest banquet attendance was about 44. **Ron** also reported that **Member, Dan Shattuc** had donated wine. **Youth Advisor, Sally Johnson** reported that we had two kids at our January meeting. **Membership Chair, Ed Sins** turned in \$27 in dues renewals. **Webmaster, Sally Johnson** noted that our club's web site has been busy with 17253 hits currently. **Sally** has added new show information to our web site. It was reported that **SJCC Life Member Richard Smith** passed away on December 13, 2009.

**Corresponding Secretary, Al Lo** was asked to send a condolence card to the family. **Hall of Fame Chair, Ed Sins** needs our nominations by next meeting.

**Old Business:** none

**New Business: Gordon Stubbs** suggested that we place left over President's Award Medals in our club auction. **Ed Sins** noted that why would a person work many hours for our club to receive a set when he could just buy a set for a few dollars. Several board members favored destroying all extra off-metal club medals. **Gordon** was instructed to destroy/deface all extra off-metal club medals. **Keith Scott** is looking for new venues to give his coin talk. **Keith** gave his coin talk at the Milpitas Public Library in January.

**Show Business: Bourse Chair, Ray Johnson** reported that just about every dealer liked our show. The only bad feature was that the room is not large enough. **Ray** noted that we had more dealers double-up on tables than ever before, and we had a large number of visiting dealers. We had over 100 room-nights rented at the Double Tree Hotel. The hotel gave us one complimentary room-night for every 40 room-nights rented. We received a complimentary room for two nights, coming in just short of a third free night. We have reserved facilities at the Double Tree Hotel for next year. Our 2011 show will be Friday through Sunday, January 28-30, 2011. There will be no Thursday set-up day. Set-up will be on Friday with dealer set-up hours of 8 AM to noon. Public show hours will be noon - 6 PM on Friday. **Ray Johnson** spoke with a stamp show promoter about having a stamp show upstairs at the same time as our coin show downstairs. **Ray** saw no downside to this arrangement. A discussion ensued over such an arrangement. **Ray** will speak to the stamp show promoter for more information. **Ray** will look into re-arranging our table lay-out to make room for more dealer tables. **Ray** noted that the Double Tree Hotel did a great job setting up the tables. **Exhibits Chair, Fred Davis** had one left-over, 2010 youth exhibit prize bronze medal of which he did not know how to dispose. **Ryan Johnson** purchased the left-over medal for \$7 to our club, since the design on the medal was **Ryan's** winning fire engine design. **Ray Johnson** requested the exhibit titles from **Fred Davis**. **Ray** further noted that last year we had 40 volunteers for our show and that this year we only needed 28. The reason for this was that the Double Tree Hotel did most of the set-up and tear-down work for us. **Ron Ishizaki** requested that exhibit judges place notes on the judging sheets.

## **POST SHOW REPORT**

Bourse Chair, Ray Johnson**

**San Jose Coin Club's Coin, Stamp and  
Collectibles Show is now history and  
can be recorded as successful.**

Having been the second time we've moved our show, in three years, no one knew exactly how the whole thing was going to turn out. In moving an event of this magnitude it usually takes years to recover. The Fair Ground's two-year run was the source of numerous and varied complaints and was a threat to the show's future, so it had to go. Parkside Hall was successful for many years, but is no longer available and cost prohibitive. The largest stumbling block to moving the show was, where can we move that will give us enough room and maintain our high dealer and visitor satisfaction? A long, exhaustive search for a new location was conducted, by several members. **Larry Benson** suggested the Double Tree Hotel and after investigation, it seemed to be the best compromise. On the negative side, it wasn't as large as we would like it to be; we would have to reduce our dealer count by a third, with room for only 60 dealers. However, on the positive side, it was everything we could want for a great show; a classy, carpeted room, in a classy hotel near the airport and the hotel offered us a great package deal on rooms, parking, set-up and just about everything else. The board made the decision to have the show at the Double Tree. Bourse applications were mailed out on June 12<sup>th</sup> and, to our amazement, the show was sold out by July 18<sup>th</sup>. It was much different working with a hotel; it has its agenda and we have ours, but the hotel was very cooperative and made bourse planning, lay-out, set-up, hotel accommodations and security a very pleasant experience. During the show, we couldn't walk down an aisle without, at least one dealer, telling us what a great location or great show it was. We have never chaired a show with so

few complaints from the dealers or show visitors. People went out of their way to seek us out and compliment us on the show. All went according to plan and we ended up with a show that we can all be proud of. Based on the positive feedback, we have booked the hotel for January 28, 29, 30, 2011 for the next San Jose Coin, Stamp and Collectibles Show, in conjunction with California State Numismatic Association's 128<sup>th</sup> Convention.

**We sincerely thank all of the show committee, who contributed so much cooperation and hard work. Without the efforts of those who stepped up to the plate and pitched in, we would never be able to put on a show of this magnitude and quality.**

**Fred Davis** noted there was an issue over the way in which the exhibit judges scored. A discussion about show youth displays ensued. It appeared that a father set-up two displays for his son and daughter, who were not at the show.

**More Old Business:** **Ryan Johnson** instructed that the Three Minute Rule for Show and Tell be enforced.

**Back to Show Business:** **CSNA Coordinator, Al Lo** thanked SJCC for a nice table in front and for the room for educational forums. **Al** noted there were about twelve people in attendance at the educational forum instead of the usual 3-4. At the CSNA Board Meeting, CSNA decided to hold its semi-annual convention with SJCC again in 2011. CSNA will look into holding its own show in 2012, possibly at the end of May. The CSNA sponsoring of our SJCC show is not a money-maker for CSNA; in fact, it incurs some expenses including the cost of executive hotel rooms, \$150 honorarium for SJCC, etc. **Board Member, Richard Shusterman** inquired about holding an auction at our show. Three dealers received prizes for \$100 off their bourse tables at our 2011 show. A discussion ensued as to whether this constituted an expense on our books. **Ryan Johnson** reported that he placed an ad for our show on Facebook. **Sally Johnson** reported that there were no broken wooden nickels received in our order this year. There were multiple motions for adjournment and multiple seconds.

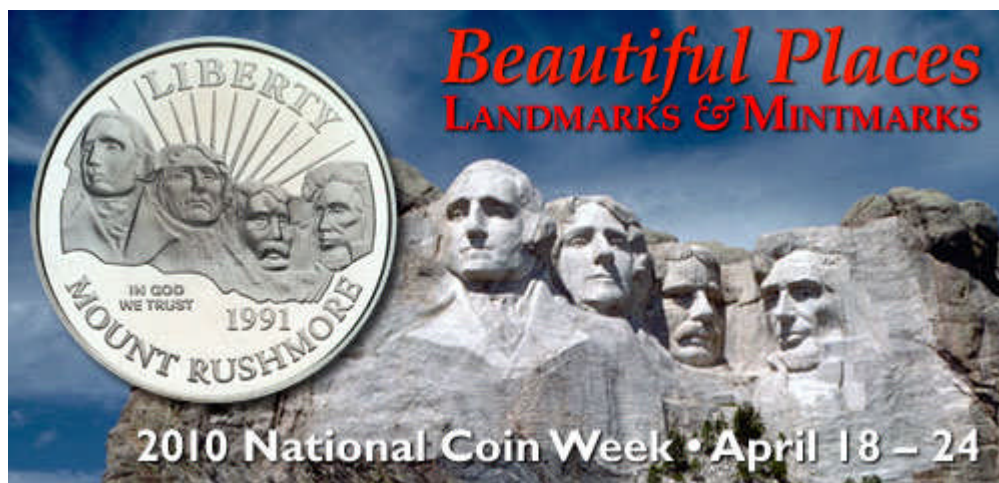

# Ready for ‘Beautiful’ quarters?

**U.S. Mint releases schedule for ‘America the Beautiful’ quarter dollars, which will feature national parks and historic sites. – By Paul Gilkes**

**A quarter dollar recognizing Hot Springs national park in Arkansas will kick off the America the Beautiful National Parks Quarters Program beginning in 2010.**

**On September 9, the U.S. Mint released a list of sites, in order of issue, which will be represented on the circulating commemorative quarter dollars, as shown on the table on the next page.**

**The America’s Beautiful National Parks Quarter Dollar Coin Act of 2008, by President George W. Bush.**

**The program comes on the heels of the popular 50 State quarters, District of Columbia and U.S. Territories quarter programs, the latter of which wraps up at the end of 2009.**

**The America the Beautiful quarter dollar series is slated to last 12 years and will showcase 56 different national parks or designated historic sites. The quarters issued will recognize national parks or designated federal historic sites within the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. territories of Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands and the Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands.**

**Five quarters will be released each year under the program, with the last quarter dollar, honoring Tuskegee Airmen National Historic Site in Alabama, scheduled as the only release for 2021.**

**In addition to authorizing quarter dollars of the standard specifications, bullion coins will be struck in .999 fine silver and will be 3 inches in diameter and weigh 5 ounces. The fineness and weight will be edge-incused.**
