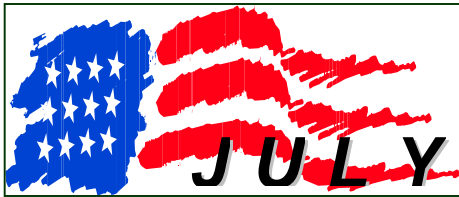

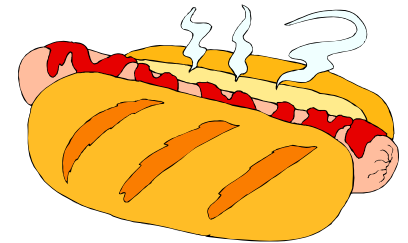

Some Numismatic Trivia

Here's some numismatic trivia found at various websites:

- The first circulating coins released by the United States in 1793 totaled \$111.78. The coins consisted of 11,178 copper cents.
- The largest gold nugget on record was found in 1869 in Victoria, Australia, and it weighed 208 pounds.
- The 1792 Coinage Act called for the minting of a "mill" or thousandth of a dollar. It was never minted.
- There are 293 ways to make change for a dollar.
- The Bureau of Engraving and Printing uses 18 tons of ink per day.
- The Philadelphia Mint covers five acres.
- All 50 states are listed across the top of the Lincoln Memorial on the back of the \$5 bill.

THEN STRAIGHT INTO THE LAS PALMAS PARK PARKING LOT

GOING SOUTH ON MATHILDA AVE. - AFTER CROSSING THE EL
CAMINO, IT TURNS INTO SUNNYVALE/SARATOGA RD., RIGHT ON
REMINGTON DR., RIGHT ON SPINOSA DR., THEN STRAIGHT INTO
THE PARK DRIVEWAY
