From the Board Meeting on February 25, 2013

- Call to order by Vice President Gordon Stubbs at 7:37pm.
- Welcome 14 board members- Vice President Gordon Stubbs; Recording Secretary Allison Paker; Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto; Treasurer Sally Johnson; Historian Ryan Johnson; Immediate Past President Martha D.; Librarian Ed Sins; Bourse Chair Ray Johnson; Curator Bill Hu.; Board Members- Fred Davis, Steve Kooij, Herb Davidson, Keith Scott; Hall of Fame Member Al Lo
- Recording Secretary Allison Paker reports we need more attendance tickets. She would like to redesign the tickets to eliminate the phone line and add two lines for guests' e-mails. Herb Davidson motioned for Allison to redesign the tickets. Steve Kooij seconded. The motion passed. Ray Johnson said it is in the by-laws that the minutes must be read at general meeting. It was discussed. Allison will write an amendment specifically saying only decisions need to be read at the general meeting.
- Treasurer Sally Johnson gave her report. All bills from the show have been paid.
- Program Chair Gordon Stubbs reports March's speaker is Bill Hu. speaking on Special Coins. May's speaker is Ed Sins. Ray Johnson is speaking in July on Changeover Coins.
- Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs passed out a worksheet on final medal sales. Ray thanked everyone who sold ticket books. Sally had aprons for raffle ticket selling. They are embroidered with San Jose Coin Club with two pockets in front for tickets and money. Sally had a special one made for Martha with Martha's name embroidered on it. Scott Griffin asked us to sell tickets at his show in April.
- Nominating Chair Al Lo reports he made an announcement at the general meeting for interested parties in running for the board to see him. We will need a Recording Secretary and a Board Member. Al asked board members to recruit anyone they think might be good for the board.
- Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto had the usual mail plus some returned show postcards. We also received an invite from Numismatic Association of Southern California to sell raffle tickets for their show in August. We would get 50% of each ticket sold. It was discussed. A question was asked about what the club can spend money on. The need for a new trailer was discussed.

- Picnic chair Keith Scott reports there are three possible dates for the picnic of July 20 or one of the first two Saturdays in August. Ray Niblett is looking into reserving a space. Picnic items will be sent to the Davis' PO box. Keith reports he will buy everything for the picnic without need for potluck.
- Banquet- The banquet is May 19th at the Three Flames. Al asked why the banquet was in May when it should be in April for officer installation. Ed said it is just a ceremony and new officers should start their duties in May. Ray suggested just having installation at the general meeting.
- Youth Chair Sally Johnson reports Evelyn Daniels was the only youth at the February meeting. Sally gave her a stack of quarters for working as auction runner. Al says Evelyn's running again for Youth President.
- Newsletter Editor Allison Paker will run the medal design rules and the banquet reservation form. Ed requested a reminder about dues. Sally asked about the number of snail mail newsletters. 13 newsletters are mailed out.
- Membership Chair Ed Sins had applications from David Daniel, Frank Schuhe, David Wiyil, and Ray Parkhurst. Ed motioned to accept the new members and Ryan seconded. The motion passed.
- Webmaster Sally Johnson reports we had 25,265 hits which is up 261 from last month. Everything is updated. Fred said he directs people asking about coin shows to the website.
- Hall of Fame Chair Ed Sins had two nominations read. The vote will be at the March Board meeting.
- Old Business - a) Martha had Presidential Awards for the Beltrams for Corresponding Secretary Lyle Okamoto to send out. Ryan suggested Robert Beltran should get a Presidential Set instead of a medal. Martha would need to get a Presidential Set box from President Bill M. Al asked for a medals box for the medals for the speakers at the show. B) Ed mentioned gold has dropped significantly and asked if we should buy gold prize now for the next show raffle. Gordon said silver is down also. Martha asked if we should buy silver now. Gordon will go to Lee Kuntz for a good price on 100-120 ounces of silver. Keith Scott moved for Gordon to buy 120 ounces of silver before Friday. Bill Hu. seconded and the motion passed. Ken Barr will be asked to look for gold pieces. Ed motioned to authorize the purchase of a \$20 Gold Eagle for 2014 show when the prize chair feels it is most expeditious. Ray and Sally seconded and the motion

passed. Bill Hu. will talk to Ken tomorrow about buying the \$20 eagle. Ryan Johnson suggested getting a second safe deposit box specifically just for silver. It was discussed. Ed moved and Ray seconded to get a second safe deposit box where the Medals Chair and President would be key holders. The motion passed. Ray said the Medals Chair would have choice of bank. Gordon will check which banks have the larger boxes. C) Lyle asked if our insurance covers the cart used at our show. Ray says it is covered under liability.

• New Business- a) Keith said someone left their auction winnings on the front table at February's meeting. B) Sally mentioned Ray Parkhurst who wanted to do coin photography. She suggested he work from 7-7:30 before our general meeting at the Treasurer's table. People need a USB storage device. Photos would be free for members but fancier pics would have a charge. C) Ryan asked about the status of the curator changeover. Bill Hu. answered that the inventory still needs to be finished. D) Al had Robert Luna's counterfeit coin handout for the Historian. One is still needed for the librarian. E) Ryan asked Allison if she'll still be Newsletter Editor. She said no and will also be quitting Refreshments Chair.

• Show Business- a) Bourse Chair Ray Johnson feels the show went well with just a few glitches. B) Rich Medefesser figured out a way around using the hotel's power distribution boxes but we were still charged for them. Ray is trying to get that cost out of the contract. C) A complete financial report will be available at the next board meeting. D) We are trying to get a jump on advertising for the 2014 show. Ad pads are available now. The show dates are locked in for 2014 & 2015. E) Sally discussed parking. Originally the machine was placed in the wrong spot. Many agreed it was easier to have the parking fee separate from the front desk fee. F) Fred thanked the Johnsons for all their work on the show. Gordon wished more people had helped out. G) Keith asked about missing cases. Ryan said between 5-10 are missing. Security will look at other shows. They are numbered and marked as to which ones are ours. H) Lyle asked about incentive for overnight security. They receive raffle tickets. I) Sally reported advertising cards were left behind at the front desk. Wristbands need to not to be ripped apart too soon because they're used to track attendance. A different color is used for each day. J) Sally suggested a cash box would be easier than a cash register.

SAN JOSE COIN CLUB MEDAL DESIGN CONTEST RULES

1. The design must be submitted by a San Jose Coin Club member.
2. The design shall be on 8 ½" by 11" unlined paper in a circle of a minimum of 4" to a maximum of 8" in diameter.
3. A maximum of two designs is allowed per person.
4. The subject matter of each submitted design may be in the form of a single drawing, photo, postcard or a group of drawings in one design. Since most members of the club are non-artists, subject matter can be cut out or photocopied pictures.
5. The subject matter of the reverse design (not included in this contest) will be the San Jose Coin Club logo and/or club information, as designated by the Board of Directors.
6. The subject matter of the obverse design shall be of the designer's choice and include the year of the next show (no show information). The Board reserves the right to reject any questionable subject matter designs.
7. A written explanation of the submitted design can be included for clarification.
8. No names or initials are permitted on your design; these will be added to the winning design after the judging.
9. If the entry is of a private or commercial subject matter, the designer must obtain written permission from that owner and submit this permission with the design. If permission is not granted, the design will be disqualified.
10. Entries may be mailed to the club address (San Jose Coin Club, PO Box 5621, San Jose, CA 95150) or brought to the General Meeting. Entries must be submitted in a sealed envelope, with the member's name, and the words 'Medal Design Contest Chair' on the outside of the envelope.
11. All entries must be postmarked or submitted on or before the date of the regular March General Meeting.
12. In the event of IDENTICAL designs, the first submitted will be entered in the contest.
13. The winning design becomes the property of the San Jose Coin Club and will not be returned; all others will be returned.
14. The San Jose Coin Club Board of Directors reserves the right to modify the winning design to meet the requirements of the minting process. Any modifications will be cleared with the designer(s).
15. If the Medal Design Contest Chair submits a design, the President, at his/her discretion, shall appoint an alternate Medal Design Contest Chair to conduct the medal design contest process.
