President, **Bill Meadows** called the meeting to order at 7:40 PM and opened the meeting with 13 seated Board Members. The Meeting was held at Denny's Located on 2077 North First Street, San Jose, CA. **Recording Secretary Ryan Johnson** waived reading the November General Meeting minutes. **Historian Harold Woron** had nothing new to report. **Corresponding Secretary, Lyle Okamoto** reported the usual club correspondence and the card that was sent to **Phil Solomon's** family was sent back. **Picnic Chair, Keith Scott** had nothing new to report. **Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs** reported that all of the medals have arrived. **Gordon** said he will go through them to ensure there are no flaws and that they will be delivered starting at the December general meeting. He also reported that we still have 180 ounces of silver remaining. **Program Chair Gordon Stubbs** reported that next month is our December Christmas party and that **Santa** will be in attendance. **Co-Youth Advisor, Ryan Johnson** reported that three youth were in attendance at the November General Meeting. **Newsletter Editor, Ryan Johnson** reported that the Second Harvest food Drive collection will continue in December and if any member would like anything to be put in the newsletter to let him know. **Librarian, Ed Sins** reported nothing new. **Membership Chair, Ed Sins** reported **Lee Wilson** renewed his

membership and we had one new member application from youth **Matthew Downing**. A motion was made to accept **Matthew Downing** as a member, the motion was seconded, the motion passed with 0-Opposed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Librarian Ed Sins wanted to know if it was going to be Show & No tell at the December meeting and if he should or should not bring the library in. **President Bill Meadows** ruled that it will not be necessary to bring in the library and it will be Show & No tell at the December meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Medals Chair Gordon Stubbs suggested that we purchase silver again if it reaches \$19.00 an ounce. It was suggested an agent be appointed to find the silver and purchase it. Discussion followed. **Gordon Stubbs** made a motion that we buy 130 ounces of silver and not to spend more than \$22 an ounce. **Ed sins** seconded the motion, 0-Opposed. **Ken Barr** volunteered to be the agent to keep track of the silver purchase.

Fred Davis reported that **Harold Woron** has created a DVD with all of the presidential coins and 20th Century coins on it. Coins vary from Pennies, Nickels, Dimes, from 1913 on. He continued to report that it was used at a school presentation.

SHOW BUSINESS:

Ray Johnson reported that the show is sold out. 58 cases and 28 lamps have been rented. We also have acquired 4 new dealers. **Paul Scott** will not be at the next show; however **Brian Jerich** will be there instead as the show's supply dealer. ANACs will also be at the show taking submissions, not to grade on site. Show security is in place and will be slightly over \$3000 and one hotel room. **Ray** continued to report we have 70 tables with 70+ dealers.

Ed Sins moved for adjournment the motion was seconded with 0-Opposed. Meeting adjourned at 8:16pm

Proposed Constitution Changes

These are proposed constitution changes and will be voted on after being published for two-consecutive meetings.

Article IV. Officers – Section 3. The president, and vice-president, having served two consecutive terms, shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office until after a two year absence from that office.

Article VIII. Duties of Officers – Section 4. The corresponding secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the club, and keeping on file all-important communications and copies of the replies thereto. The corresponding secretary and treasurer shall retain a copy of the key for the Post Office Box. Upon expiration of his/her term of office shall turn over to the successor all books, records, and accessories, of the office taking a receipt therefore.

Article VIII. Duties of Officers – Section 10. The coin show Bourse Chair shall, as a key member of the Show Committee, be responsible for bourse dealer participation at the San Jose Coin Club Coin, Stamp and Collectibles Show. He/she will create and maintain a current list of possible bourse dealer participants, mail out or distribute bourse applications, receive bourse applications and maintain an accounting of table type, table location, quantity of cases and lamps, show program advertising, requested advertising literature, etc., turn in and account for all monies received from bourse dealers to the club treasurer, send out bourse confirmations, check in dealers at the show, interface with dealers to answer questions and resolve problems, maintain a continuous liaison with bourse dealers to promote and improve the show. The Bourse Chair shall

report, regularly, to the Show General Chair and Board of Directors the status of the bourse and shall make recommendations as needed. It is recommended, but not mandatory, that (1) this position have a duration of five years, so as to maintain a consistent and stable relationship with the bourse dealers, (2) the Bourse Chair's replacement work with him/her for at least six months to a year prior to assuming full responsibility, and (3) the Bourse Chair's replacement have the means (a computer) to create, produce, and maintain documents and records pertaining to the position. At the end of his/her term of office, he/she shall turn over all club property and records to his/her successor taking a receipt therefore.

Article VIII. Duties of Officers – Section 11. The Web Master (feminine web mistress), also called the system administrator, the author, or the website administrator, is the person responsible for designing, developing, marketing, or maintaining a website. Core responsibilities of the webmaster include the regulation and management of access rights of different users of a web site, the appearance, and setting up of web site navigation. Content placement can be part of a webmaster's responsibilities; typically, the webmaster is the agent who reads user feedback and complaints about the site functionality. At the end of his/her term of office, he/she shall turn over all club property and records to his/her successor taking a receipt therefore.
