At the June 23rd Board Meeting Continued from Pg. 2

It was suggested to just mail the clock instead of a picture. Ed Sins reported that we missed our clubs 800th meeting anniversary last month and that so far we have only had one skipped meeting. Ryan Johnson requested the Recording Secretaries reports again from Lyle Okamoto to complete the records, Lyle stated he's trying to find them. Sally Johnson reported that Cupertino Coin Club still owes \$150 for renting San Jose Coin Clubs equipment for 2009 and \$150 for 2014. Sally stated she was incredibly offended by Gary Acquistapace stating that her records were not accurate and passed out copies of the checks that have been cashed from Cupertino Coin Club and checks that were never received. Fred Davis stated it will be brought up at the CCC board meeting on Wednesday. Sally passed out an updated rental agreement. Ryan Johnson made a motion to accept the contract and to amend the contract to state the cost of \$150 to be placed on the contract, and to change the dates of when the money is due from March to July. Johnson Seconded motion. 0-Opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Martha Davis reported that the storage fee is due for the trailer at Lockheed Martin. Martha also reported that John Jencek is looking to rent 50-75 cases for his show in San Francisco. Discussion. followed whether or not it was possible to get someone to take the cases to San Francisco, no one volunteered. Ed Sins made a motion to decline. The motion was 0-Opposed. seconded. Sally Johnson reported mail problems with mail being opened by the corresponding secretary and emailed

individuals. Sally **Johnson** presented emails that the corresponding secretary sent out containing bank statements, letters from the county, and letters from Willow Glenn storage. Sally made a request to not have club mail opened that is addressed to her. Gordon stated that just because that mail is addressed to the club, but it doesn't mean that it needs to be shared. Sally asked the question as to why information is discrediting being shared about the board and wanted to know why emails are being sent in an attempt to destroy the club. Harold Woron stated that the club needs to try and reach out to younger people and newer people. Ryan Johnson suggested looking at an alternative day aside from Monday for board meetings due to the fact our show usually concludes the day before the meeting and there is insufficient time to gather information for the meeting as well as with the stadium coming in the freeways are going to be more congested on Mondays.
